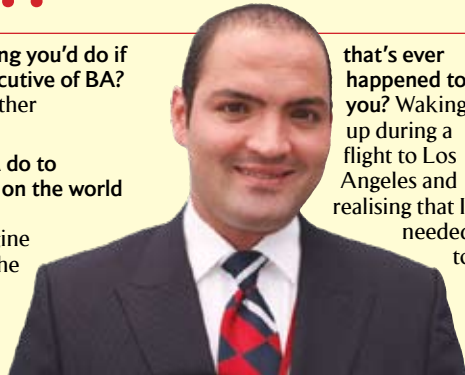

# Crimefighters make a run for it in New York

**A GROUP of British police officers went 'on the run' in New York to raise money for a child cancer charity – with a little lift from British Airways.**

The 75-strong team of officers, staff and supporters flew to the Big Apple with the airline for two half-marathons through Central Park to raise money for the Jack Brown Appeal.

They were helped on their way thanks to John Humphreys, group supervisor, based at ContactBA in Manchester.

PC Mark Edwards, who organised the event, said: "Due to the number of people involved, this has been a huge logistical effort on his part and we are incredibly grateful to John."

Keren Lovett, from community investment, was also praised for her long-standing support.

The appeal was set up by Met detective sergeants Yvonne and Richard Brown to help fund research to find a cure for the childhood cancer neuroblastoma.

Their seven-year-old son Jack, who was diagnosed with the condition in 2004, sadly died in May this year, but fundraising events for the charity continue in his memory.

# Starry car drives fundraising

BRITISH service people have been given a further boost from British Airways as part of the airline's support for them.
